Enclosed is a petition signed by more than 50 Manteca residents over the age of 18 in support of requesting your consideration to rename Lincoln Park to Marion Elliott Park. This park is a natural choice to name for Mr. Elliott due to his many years as principal of Lincoln School. We are confident of our ability to get many more signatures, but in the interest of time, we are submitting the petition with only slightly more than the required minimum. We are happy to tell you that, in the event that the City Council approves the request to designate Lincoln Park as Marion Elliott Park, we have secured private funding for whatever signage is needed to meet the city's specifications.

The nominee was received into the Roman Catholic Church in 1954 at the age of 20. Soon thereafter, he began offering his time and talents to the Parish and faith community. His participation in the ministries of the Parish is continual and endless. He has touched many lives from the youth to the seasoned. He is a tremendous asset to our Parish as well as the entire Church.

As an educator, he began sharing his talent while teaching eighth-grade Catechism classes for over 10 years. He was awarded the Pius X medal in 1969. Not only was he preparing young adults for Confirmation, he also was a chaperone on many trips with the candidates. He is mentor at St. Anthony of Padua Parish School, having serving on various accreditation review committees. His activities include the interviewing of new lectors and coordinating their assignments. He works closely with the pastor in assigning Lectors for weekly and holiday masses. He currently represents the Lectors group on the Parish Liturgy Committee.

State Commissioner from 1977 until 1989, when he was elected to the Babe Ruth League, Inc. Board of Directors as the Pacific Southwest Regional Commissioner. He retired from the Babe Ruth program in the Fall of 2008. Professionally, Elliott is a retired principal from Lincoln School in Manteca. He received his Masters degree from California State University.



Jim Lemp of Cheyenne, Wyoming, a member of the Babe Ruth League, Inc. Board of Directors, started in the Babe Ruth program in 1959 serving as a Team Manager, League President, Secretary and Treasurer. After leaving the local league level, he served as District Commissioner, Assistant State Commissioner, State

Commissioner and Assistant Regional Commissioner until being elected to the Babe Ruth League, Inc. Board of Directors as the Pacific Northwest Regional Commissioner in 1983, and in 2000 when he became an At-Large Member. Mr. Lemp retired from the Union Pacific Railroad after 43 years of service. He was awarded the Wyoming Park and Recreation Award for a Non-Professional and Cheyenne's "Golden Deeds" Award for "Man of the Year".

Manteca's Marion Elliott has been a mble servant to local youth baseball r 44 years. In all that time, he has never ceived a paycheck.

His only wages are the sights and unds of Manteca's youngsters playing e game they love.

"The bottom line is I love to watch kids ay baseball," Elliott said. "I am very

of being able to provide activities ys who want to learn to play basell and keep them busy at a very critical riod in their lives."

Elliott will wrap up his final term as Babe Ruth League Inc. international ard member in October 2008. By then, he will be 74 and will have held titles as a district commissioner, state commissioner, regional commissioner and, of course, Manteca Babe Ruth president.

He has been an active international board member for 17 years, during which he has been involved in Babe Ruth's bud-

getary decisions and rule changes. He also runs a Babe Ruth World Series each year, the same type of tournament East Union High's 16-year-old team attended in 2003.

In 1962, Elliott — then a struggling young teacher

working in the summertime for the Manteca Parks and Recreation department—founded the Manteca Babe Ruth program.

He recognized the lack of a program for 13- to 15-year-olds in Manteca, so he got in touch with Stockton Babe Ruth. He threw together two teams to play in Stockton that year, before fielding four in 1963 and six a year later. Now, the Manteca Babe Ruth program is in full bloom and is often a contender in the district and regional playoffs. Last year, a 15-year-old Babe Ruth All-Star team advanced into the Central California State Tournament, where it finished third.

"Ine is Manteca, and some mediocre ones," Elliott said, "But they all have fun and learn some skill about the game of baseball."

Despite his deep involvement in Babe Ruth baseball, it won't be too diffi-

cult for Elliott to step down from his post. He says he looks forward to spending time with his family.

"I am enjoying being a grandfather, and that's probably something I will focus on after my term is up," Elliott said with a laugh. "I don't think I will miss it much, because I will still be around to watch some games."

Elliott serves as parade grand marshal

Marion Elliott — a man who has devoted his life to educating youth as well as supporting recreational activities for young people — is serving as the Grand Marshal for this year's Manteca Fourth of July parade.

Elliott was born in Bakersfield on July 14, 1934 and moved to Manteca at age 9.


The 1952 Manteca High graduate was hired as a sixth grade teacher for the then-new New Haven School after a two-year stint in the Army at White Sands in New Mexico.

The Fresno State graduate obtained his Masters in Education from Stanislaus State in 1979. He was employed for 37 years in the Manteca Unified School District. He taught at New Haven, Golden West, and Lathrop. His administrative

career included stints as vice principal at Lathrop School and Manteca High and 17 years as Lincoln School principal when he retired in June of 1995.

He was a part-time recreation director for the City of Manteca and was responsible for starting the adult softball league. He was involved in the first Manteca babe Ruth Baseball League and has served as district, state, regional, and international commissioner for the baseball organization. Elliott served as executive secretary of the National Babe Ruth Umpires Association and served as a high school baseball umpire and has officiated basketball and football in previous years. Elliott is a big fan of Manteca history, writing the "Manteca History" and "Sports Yesteryear" columns for the Manteca Bulletin. He is already a member of the Manteca High Hall of Fame and the national Babe Ruth Hall of Fame.

Introduce yourself, what you do and your relation to Marion Elliott: My name is Susan Swift. I am Marion's oldest daughter – the middle child.

What do you know to be true about Marion? He is a statistician and a historian. My dad is very organized and structured. He has always said you get more done and accomplished by being organized. He said he learned that in the Army.

Tell me a funny or just a great story: If you are at my parents' house around 9:00pm, he will start taking off his shoes and socks, he will say good night and then head to the shower – that's your clue to leave.

What does Marion like to do for fun? He enjoys visiting with his family and friends and going to sporting events – especially high school sporting events.

Why is Marion Elliott such a treasure to Manteca? He loves Manteca and the history that formed Manteca. He was raised in Manteca. After college and serving in the Army, he and my Mom returned to Manteca where they worked and raised their family. He has volunteered and continues to volunteer with many different organizations benefiting Manteca. He has done this throughout his entire adult life. I cannot remember all of the things he has been affiliated with or involved in.

For a number of years, he was the part-time Recreation Director for the City of Manteca. During that time, he organized not only youth sports but adult softball and basketball leagues and he put on tournaments.

He began Babe Ruth baseball in Manteca.

While teaching, he was the softball coach at Lathrop School. He also took his algebra class to the Math tournament at UOP every year. He chaperoned school dances. He and my Mom chaperoned a bicentennial trip to Boston with high school students.

He is very involved with his faith community at St. Anthony's Catholic Church. He taught eighth grade CCD at St. Anthony's for many years.

For the city, he has organized essay contests and was on scholarship committees. Manteca used to have high school marching band reviews (or parades). He organized those. He organized basketball tournaments.

When we were in high school in the 1970's, he would write the East Union High School sports articles for the Manteca Bulletin. After the games, he would also call in the stats to the Stockton Record and Modesto Bee. He continues to write the history and sports history columns for the Manteca Bulletin.

He also umpired or officiated high school football, basketball and baseball games.

Is there anything that that you would like to say about Mr. Elliott – that I did not ask you. Not only was he a great teacher, educator, administrator, he enjoyed organizing youth sports and adult leagues because these activities kept and keep kids and people "off the street" and out of trouble so to speak.

If you grew up in Manteca from the 1940's, you may have gone to school with him, were a student of his, you knew him from St Anthony's or knew him from a sporting event or was on a committee with him.

He is a great public speaker. He has emceed many events. When he was in College (he went to Fresno State) he would come home on Fridays to announce the Manteca High Football games.

Tell me something about Mr. Elliott that you'd like to say to him, that you have never told him. He is the best father anyone could ask for. He is a great role model. We have awesome parents and I love them very much. I definitely do not say that enough.
